## St. Nicholas Visits Holy Rosary



On the Feast Day of St. Nicholas, Friday, Dec. 6th, St. Nicholas visited the youth at Holy Rosary School and handed out candy canes. Father Michael and Mrs. Larson accompanied him to the classrooms and Fr. Michael shared the story and history of St. Nick with students and teachers.

St. Nicholas is one icon of the holiday season that has meaning in both the secular and spiritual celebrations of Christmas. We know that St. Nicholas was born at the end of the third century in Asia Minor. His parents died when he was young and left him well off. His uncle, the archbishop of Myra (southeast of Turkey), ordained him and upon his uncle's death, Nicholas served as bishop until his own death.

One legend involving St. Nicholas concerns a desperate man on the verge of selling his daughters into slavery to pay his debts. Nicholas secretly threw a bag of gold into an open window in the man's house to stop him. His charity and generosity are remembered through the custom of placing one's shoes by the door in hopes of receiving a small treat. We can learn from his generosity to the poor, and imitate his acts of kindness to others.



End of the day parent pick-up line: School is out at 3:15 p.m. Parents using the outside pickup line should use the following procedure: Enter the parking lot off Lake Avenue (2<sup>nd</sup>driveway – south of church). Slowly drive around the circle to the pick-up spot in front of the Welcoming Center Doors. Please keep a tight line, leaving only a couple feet between vehicles. This will allow more vehicles in the parking lot and prevent some from hanging out onto the street. If you are the first car in line, please pull your vehicle all the way up to the tree in the landscape bed, just before the pickup circle. When your car is completely stopped, the teachers will allow your child to pass the "safety line" and enter the vehicle. For our children's safety, we do not want them running through the parking lot to your vehicle. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping everyone safe!

#### Student absence:

If your child is **absent** for any reason, please call the office that day or in advance. Please leave a message on the voice mail if there is no answer. We always check the voice mail. We would like to make sure that we know your child is safe at home if they are not attending school. This communication from you is very important. If you are unable to contact the school by phone, send a written note to the teacher when your child returns. State law indicates that any student absent for three or more days during the school year without a valid excuse is considered truant.

Weather Policy: All children are expected to go outside for noon recess. Your child can stay *inside* only if the school is provided with a doctor's excuse. In colder weather the time is shortened and in extreme cold or wet weather noon recess is cancelled and children stay inside. When the temperature/wind chill reaches -10 below zero all students may be required to stay inside. Also, in the event that school is cancelled due to bad weather, you will receive a phone call, text, and email from the Holy Rosary "School Messenger" Parent Contact System. Also, please listen to KDLM or KRCQ radio stations, or WDAY TV. If Detroit Lakes Public Schools are cancelled, Holy Rosary School and Preschool are also cancelled, as we bus together. If school is two hours late when there is half day preschool, morning preschool is cancelled.
