## STEM IN 3RD GRADE AND MORE

In third grade, students transition to upper elementary concepts and expectations. In this grade, students focus on reading comprehension through the use of Accelerated Reader as well as class novel projects. They also build their writing skills through various writing projects and spelling skills through weekly tests. In math, students work toward mastery of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts. Science curriculum is supplemented with hands-on S.T.E.M. activities. To further their relationship with God, students memorize many prayers, participate in weekly Masses, are involved in altar serving, and serve others by reading to residents at Oak Crossing.

### OUTSTANDING MIDDLE SCHOOL

Our middle school students travel between classrooms depending on the subject, which teaches self reliance, responsibility, organization, and time management skills. Each student has his/her own chrome book that they use throughout the week. There is a strong emphasis (or robust curriculum) on the five core classes of math, science, social studies, language arts, and religion. Special courses such as health, technology, FACS, music, physical education, art, band, and choir are part of the curriculum.

Sixth graders take a basic skills math course, progress to pre-algebra, and end with algebra. All middle schoolers will take each of the following science courses over their three years: Earth Science, Life Science, and Physical Science. Social studies progresses from Minnesota Studies, to U.S. History, and finally World History & Geography. The language arts curriculum covers the areas of grammar skills, composition, literature, and comprehension. We emphasize an environment rich in books, which promotes independent read-

ing. Additionally, we provide speaking opportunities to encourage the practice of precise, formal speech.

In religion, students study the Old and New Testament along with Jesus's teachings. Through this study students grow in their faith and know they are called by God to be stewards of His grace – creating a foundation to guide them in the years ahead. The middle school students also serve as role models for the younger students in the school and have many leadership opportunities.

## 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Explores Physical Science

In the 5<sup>th</sup> grade classroom, students at Holy Rosary experimented with 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter's physical science unit in a variety of fun ways.

In a states-of-matter lesson, students witnessed first-hand how a liquid and a solid could produce a gas.

"When students asked if we could blow something up, I said yes," says teacher Ms. Baker. "Little did they know it would be just balloons with bottles, baking soda, and vinegar!" In this lesson, students learned how safety with goggles, gloves, and lab jackets is important. Additionally, they learned how gas can expand.

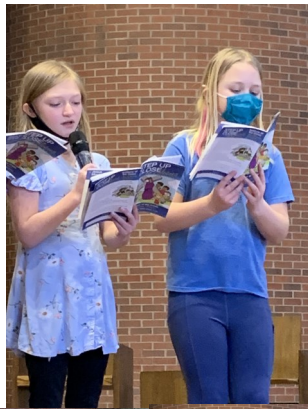
February's studies included chemical and physical reactions. Each student brought two liquids into school, and the class combined liquids to observe and study density and reactivity. Who knew ranch, bleach, and lemonade would produce heat when combined? This raised many questions for the students – which is what science is all about!

Stepping forward a month, "aha moments" weren't the only lightbulbs lighting up in the classroom in March. Building circuits with batteries, wires, and light bulbs was quite a shocker for some students! They learned that electricity is a current and will not be produced if certain connections aren't made. The class even created a large circuit with each student holding an item all at once. Moving out of the physical science unit and into the life science unit, 5<sup>th</sup> grade will dig into experimentation and observation even further in equally exciting ways.
