A few last minute notes for the Marathon

- ◆ Please dress in layers, it might be hot, cold, raining or snowing... In case of inclement weather the route will be shortened.
- ◆ Water and cookies will be served at rest stops.
- ◆ A bathroom will be available at the 4th rest stop in the bowling alley.
- ◆ The marathon route is approximately 11 miles.
- ◆ Registration begins at 12:15 p.m.
- ◆ Start time will be at 1 p.m. from our school parking lot going down Washington Avenue towards the stop light where we will go left around the new turnabout to Willow Street then left on Roosevelt Avenue and go around the entire lake, coming back up West Lake Drive, take left at Lake Avenue (next to Lakeside) and back to school. The route will be clearly marked.
- ◆ Volunteers and parents will be helping to guide everyone through intersections.
- ◆ Preschool, Kindergarten and 1st grade students do not need to go all the way around. There will be patrol trucks going constantly if anyone needs to be picked up and brought back to school.
- ◆ We strongly encourage helmets.
- ◆ Fr. Chuck will be handing out ice cream treats at the finish line.
- ◆ Pledge sheets and money are due by Friday, October 23rd to count for prizes. Please make sure to record your name and total amount earned on the pledge sheet.

Stary Family Scholarship:

This year Sidney Lundberg was awarded a scholarship from the Percy And Winifred Stary Scholarship Fund. Percy Freeman "P.F." and Win (Daley) Stary were Holy Rosary parish members from 1927 through 1971. During that time, each of their four children attended eight years at Holy Rosary School. Bill graduating in 1942, Jack in 1943, Mary in 1947, and Paul in 1951. This scholarship has been established in gratitude of past Holy Rosary Education opportunities and as a means of supporting the continuing role of Holy Rosary education in this community.

To apply for this scholarship, applicants must have been a Holy Rosary student who has completed the last three years in sixth through eighth grade. Future applicants must maintain at least a B average in high school and must be pursuing an undergraduate degree/major if attending a four year college, or a specific certificate if attending a two year college. The selection of a scholarship recipient will favor eligible candidates who are pursuing degrees/certificates that embrace the science, technical, engineering or mathematics fields of study, as opposed to the arts, business, social or life sciences fields of study.

Congratulations to Sidney Lundberg, the 2020 scholarship recipient of \$3,000.

Sidney is studying Physical Therapy at the College of St. Scholastica, Duluth.



She was an 8th grade Holy Rosary School graduate in 2015 and graduated Detroit Lakes High School in 2019. Sidney said that her favorite memories of Holy Rosary School were with her classmates. She remembers marble parties with Ms. Buntje and Mrs. Kennedy, in second grade, and is thankful for the challenge she received in middle school, which prepared her academically for high school and college. She said it was a lot of homework but it was worth it!
