Holy Rosary School's 2022 Art Fair on Friday, March 17th was a tremendous hit with students, teachers, parents and judges! Rather than doing a science project or biography of a famous person (as they've done in the past), the 5th-8th graders were given a little more flexibility this year and allowed to research and present an arts-related project. The three graded components of the project were Poster, Art Creation, and Speech/Presentation. Nine judges (all area artists) were on hand the night of the fair to listen to the students' presentation and give their scores. Those scores were combined with scores from the students' teachers to determine the top three finalists in 5th through 8th grade. Winners were announced and awarded trophies/medals after morning prayer on March 21st. Above, are the three best overall projects for 5th-8th grade. Overall winner was Zada Foltz for her Textile Art Project and the creation of a beautiful white dress. Leah Christiansen took second for her presentation on glassblowing and her delicate glass sculptures. Josh Stone took third for his project on Gothic Architecture and his stunning church model. 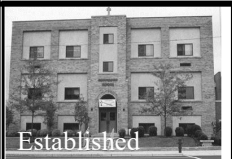

Pizza, Pizza!

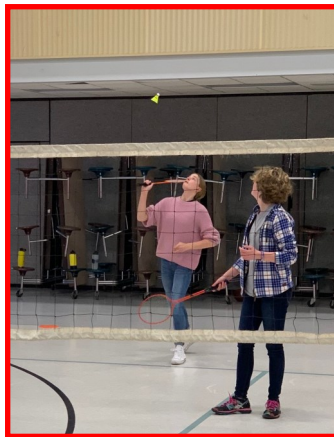
Mrs. Buntje's 2nd graders cooked up some pizzas earlier this month, but they didn't make them for lunch. The pizzas were part of a study on "irreversible
