Communication Envelopes

Your family's envelope is sent home with your (oldest) child most Thursdays. It has important information such as report cards, forms, hot lunch statements, newsletters, etc... Please sign the envelope and *return it* with your child the following day.

Most Holy Rosary School charges can be paid online. Across the top of the school's web page is a red bar. On the red bar, in the upper right hand corner there is a link that reads "PAY HERE FOR LUNCH/MILK/SNACK/PLANNER." This will send you to the parish online payment area. Just search for the item you are wanting to pay for—pay for it—and you're done. Thank you!

End of the Day Parent Pick-up Line

Please use the parent pick-up procedure to avoid parking lot trauma! Enter the parking lot from Lake Avenue, slowly drive around the parking lot to the welcoming center doors and your child will come to your vehicle when you pull up. For our children's safety, we do not want them running through the parking lot. School is dismissed at 3:10 p.m. & students are at the parent pickup area at 3:20 p.m.

Bad Weather Policy

<u>All</u> children are expected to go outside for noon recess. Your child can stay *inside* only if the school is provided with a doctor's excuse. In colder weather, the time is shortened and in extreme cold or wet weather children stay inside. When the temperature/wind chill reaches 10 below zero all students may be required to stay inside. Also, in the event that school is cancelled due to bad weather, you will receive a phone call, text, and email from the Holy Rosary "School Messenger" Parent Contact System. Also, please listen to KDLM or KRCQ radio stations, or WDAY TV. If Detroit Lakes Public Schools are cancelled, Holy Rosary School and Preschool are also cancelled, as we bus together.

First Week of School

The first week of school is packed full of fifth grade training and practice. On Thursday, the 8th, students learned how to respectfully handle, lift, and fold the American Flag with Jodi and Nate Flugel who have both served actively for our nation. The next day, students followed Patrol instruction from Lynn Wolf, who taught fifth grade at Holy Rosary for over fifteen years. Safety Patrol is responsible for guiding the walking students safely across the roads around the school. At the end of the year, if services with the flag and Safety Patrol have been successfully completed, students will receive certificates on Award's Day to keep as recognition for their work. –Mrs. Larson


This year, Holy Rosary School is participating in its 50th Annual Marathon for Nonpublic Education!


