The Junior Envirothon is a competition sponsored by natural resource agencies like the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. Regional schools organize teams of 5 students each from grades 6-8. The competition itself is structured as 5 stations focused on a specific topic in natural resources. The topics are: wildlife, forestry, wetlands, soils, and current issues. Students work as a team to answer a series of questions at each station. Awards are given based on each team's overall score. This year, Holy Rosary School fielded 2 teams of 8th graders. Team A consisted of: Peyton Lorentz, Anissa Newberg, Leah Christiansen, Audrey Flugel, and Trey Martodam. They won first place. Our Team B took second place and was made up of: Jayden Jasken, Talyn Anderson, Sam Loreth, Lauren Kemper, and Mailyn Aligada,. Mason Deraney and Freddie Steffl served as alternates. All of the students spent the 3 weeks before the competition studying 2 of the subject areas intensely in order to contribute to each team's success. From the desk of Mr. Dahlberg: Phenology is the science of documenting changes and events in nature. Often this includes things like the first or last appearance of migrating birds or butterflies; blooming of wildflowers; budding, changing color, and falling of leaves; first or last frosts of the year; and so on. Northern Community Radio (KAXE/KBXE) out of Grand Rapids and Bemidji (kaxe.org) devotes part of the morning show on Tuesdays to reporting on phenology. One part of that is the airing of reports sent in by classrooms around the state. The 6th and 7th grades at HRS have started producing these talkback segments. You can listen to them at:
