In order to tackle science phenomena standards in 5th grade, students recently embarked on a monthlong bean experiment. First, students researched some "watering liquids" they are interested in

working with in order to make accurate hypothesis: What is this liquid going to do to my growing bean sprouts? Then, students observed properties of their sprouts as they grow, and once all are mature, new liquids are administered three times a week. Students will "water" their sprouts with two liquids of their choice – this year's liquids include food dye, energy drinks, sparkling water, household cleaning products, fruit juices, and more. Will students' research-based hypothesis of what the liquids will do to the plants turn out accurate? Stay tuned to find out! -Ms. Baker


