
<u>Why:</u> To show our appreciation for the wonderful job you do as Altar Servers and know that we really do thank you for helping in this important ministry.

#### Thursday - Celebrating Vocations


- Flannel/Western Day Dress up in your flannels, cowboy hats & boots! Yee-haw!
