# Holy Rosary School's faithful volunteers named the Diocese of Crookston's Honorary Couple of the Year





Several times a week you can find both Jim Wolf supervising Holy Rosary School students on the playground and Lynn Wolf washing dishes in the school kitchen.

After growing up in different towns in western North Dakota, Jim and Lynn Wolf of Detroit Lakes met the first day of registration at Dickinson State University in the fall of 1969. As they got to know each other, time with each other's family was important and before long, Jim and Lynn knew they wanted to spend their lives together. When Jim and Lynn got married December 27, 1971, at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Dickinson, ND, they weren't thinking about celebrating their 50th anniversary. Still, they knew God had to be at the center of their marriage for it to be successful.

"Church and family have been an important part of our lives, before marriage and after, and they are now more than ever!" said Lynn. "As God blessed our marriage with children, putting God first began to become more important than ever. We realized that just attending Mass and observing Holy Days was not enough. Things were always better, easier, doable, when we prayed more and asked for God's help or what we could do for him."

From the beginning, Jim and Lynn wanted their family to be more than just the two of them. They happily accepted God's gifts of children. "Our children are one of the best things in our marriage," Jim said. "They are truly our gift from God, and they have helped our marriage to grow in faith and love. Raising them together, working to provide for them, watching them grow through their joys and challenges into loving people with morals and values, learning from them, has truly been a blessing to us."

"Even though neither of us attended Catholic School ourselves, we had a deep desire to have our children attend Catholic School," said Lynn. "We knew we wanted to have the influence of God and Catholic teachings in our children's everyday life. All three of our children attended and graduated from Holy Rosary Catholic School in Detroit Lakes, Minn., and then finished their schooling at Detroit Lakes Public High School."

In the 40 years they have lived in Detroit Lakes, both Lynn and Jim have volunteered their time and talents with Holy Rosary Catholic Church and School. They both have felt called to be active members of their parish and its school. Jim has been a parish festival volunteer for more than 20 years; called bingo for 10 years, taught religious education for fifth graders for one year, has been a mentor in RCIA and volunteers in the food pantry and Holy Rosary School. He serves as usher and Eucharistic minister. As a Fourth Degree Knight, Jim is currently serving his second term as the Knights of Columbus Grand Knight of the Third Degree.

#### End of the day parent pick-up line:

Please use the parent pick-up procedure to avoid parking lot trauma! Enter the parking lot from Lake Avenue, slowly drive around the parking lot to the welcoming center doors and your child will come to your vehicle when you pull up. For our children's safety, we do not want them running through the parking lot. School is dismissed at 3:10 p.m. & students are at the parent pickup area at 3:15 p.m.

#### Student absence:

If your child is **absent** for any reason, please call the office that day or in advance. Please leave a message on the voicemail if there is no answer. We want to make sure your child is safe at home if they are not at school. This communication from you is very important. If you are unable to contact the school by phone, send a written note to the teacher when your child returns. State law indicates that any student absent for three or more days during the school year without a valid excuse is considered truant.

### **Bad Weather Policy**

All children are expected to go outside for noon recess. Your child can stay inside only if the school is provided with a doctor's excuse. In colder weather, the time is shortened and in extreme cold or wet weather children stay inside. When the temperature/ wind chill reaches 10 below zero all students may be required to stay inside. Also, in the event that school is cancelled due to bad weather, you will receive a phone call, text, and email from the Holy Rosary "School Messenger" Parent Contact System. Also, please listen to KDLM or KRCQ radio stations, or WDAY TV. If Detroit Lakes Public Schools are cancelled, Holy Rosary School and Preschool are also cancelled, as we bus together.
