# The Percy & Winifred Stary Family Scholarship for Science, Engineering or Mathematics Fields of Study

For those graduating 8th grade, don't forget to apply at the end of your first year of college! Contact Jamie McDougall for more information or go to the alumni tab on the school website.

Students who complete the last three years at Holy Rosary School are eligible for the Percy and Winifred Stary College Scholarship. (Up to \$5,000 each year for two years.)

- The student must have attended grade 6 8 and have graduated from Holy Rosary Catholic School. The student must have maintained a B average or better for the last years of high school.
- The student must have completed the first year of a four year or two year college and maintained a 'B' average or better. A 'B' average or better must be maintained to be eligible for a successive scholarship. No individual student will be awarded the scholarship for more than two years and must be applied for within two consecutive years. (four year college).
- 3) Must be pursuing an undergraduate degree/major if attending a four year college, or a specific certificate if attending a two year college. The selection of a scholarship recipient will favor eligible candidates who are pursuing degrees/certificates that embrace the science, technical, engineering or mathematics fields of study, as opposed to the arts, business, social or life sciences fields of study.


